From the r/about at Stranmillis College & going along the Stranmillis Rd towards Malone Rd, Richmond Park is the 2nd exit on the L. No 59 is on the L. **Visits by arrangement June to Oct for groups of 5 to 20. Adm £5, chd free.** Described by Shirley Lanigan, in 'The Open Gardens of Ireland', as a garden that 'has become a favourite horticultural destination', and 'a veritable sea of plants', this is an imaginatively designed naturalistic city garden that combines a vibrant mix of annuals, perennials, grasses, shrubs and trees set within a formal layout. Former winner of BBC UK TV 'Gardener of the Year' competition. Featured in Autumn 2025 issue of 'The Irish Garden' magazine.

## NEW ALDER COTTAGE C2

71 Printshop Road, Nutts Corner, Crumlin, BT29 4YN. Elizabeth & James Stothers, 07870 203459, [estothers51@gmail.com](mailto:estothers51@gmail.com). Printshop Rd off 7m straight. Coming from Antrim join the 7m straight heading for Nutts Corner after large farm buildings on R, turn L into Printshop Rd take the 3rd laneway to the top. **Visits by arrangement in May for groups of 6 to 20. Adm £5, chd free.** A mature and natural habitat created for wildlife with a water rill pond containing Koi and a wildlife pond. Inc a small glade with ferns and grasses. The garden wraps around the one level house with mature shrubs and flower beds with priority given to wildlife and is organic. Two greenhouses and planters are used for family produce.

Drive through Ballycastle, pass hotel on L, 2nd exit at r/about to Cushendall. From Ballyvoy drive 3/4 m, Ballynagard Rd is on R. Drive 3/4 m. Arrive at 1st bungalow on R. **Visits by arrangement 12 June to 28 Aug for groups of up to 10. Adm £5, chd free.**

A challenging 1/2 acre site 400ft above sea level with stunning rural and sea views. Designed to meet prevailing environmental conditions and to protect each section from severe winds. Seasonal planting with mature shrubs and rockery on a terraced site create cosy contrasting rooms with seating area. Regret unsuitable for young children due to steep paths through rockery.

Ballyrobert Gardens is a uniquely created Ulster Garden. The setting for the garden is a C17 landscape complete with the original cottage, barn and wilding area extending to 16 acres. Sensitively integrating the elements is a six acre garden containing an extensive collection of plants. Appeared on BBC TV's Breakfast programme as an exemplar naturalistic garden. There will be a guided tour at 1pm and 3pm. Traditional entrance, extensive plant collection, small lake/large pond, large spiral, concentric rings and Bridgid's Cross in the wilding area. Traditional buildings inc the cottage and nearby barn. Stream running through a glen. Access is available for key areas in the garden.

## BENVARDEN GARDENS C1

36 Benvardin Road, Ballybogey, Ballymoney, BT53 6NN. Hugh Montgomery, [www.benvarden.co.uk](http://www.benvarden.co.uk). Between Ballybogey & Derrykeigan, N.Antrim. From Ballymoney head toward Portrush, in the village of Ballybogey turn R into the Benvardin Rd after 1/2 m (before the River Bush) the Gardens are on your R. **Sat 21, Sun 22 Feb (12-4). Adm £7, chd free. Tea, coffee & cake in Stableyard Tearoom.** Refreshments in aid of local charity.

The garden at Benvarden has been enclosed since the mid C17, most probably evolved from a semi-fortified Bawn. It is shown on a 1788 map soon after the neighbouring rhomboid cobbled courtyard was built. Bought by the Montgomery family in 1797, it was transformed into a modern walled garden with the bawn wall faced with brick and the height raised to the present 16ft, with paths and beds laid out. From the pond, paths lead to the banks of the River Bush, well-known as the river which leads to the Bushmills Distillery, the world's oldest whiskey, and here the river is spanned by a splendid bridge, built by Robert James Montgomery, who survived the charge of the Heavy Brigade in the Crimean war.

Sat 20, Sun 21 June (1-5). Home-made teas on the lawn. Limited refreshments at snowdrop**

**opening. Adm £7, chd free. 2027: Sat 13, Sun 14 Feb.** Refreshments in aid of Northern Ireland Kidney Research Fund. A mature 3 acre garden on an historic site. Front of the Georgian Rectory is a lawn with shrubs, pond and summerhouse. Integrated into the garden are 20 small peace gardens. See guide for further information. There is the Old Orchard Nature Garden comprising of one acre.

Living better with nature. A rewilding habitat created during lockdown 2020. This 15 acre site inc a two acre pond, native wildflower meadows, marginal plants, water lilies, moorhens, mallard ducks and little grebes. The 1 mile undulating walk around the perimeter of Brockkagh Wood will enrich our lives and help us to reconnect with Mother Nature. Key to a happy and healthy life. Featured on BBC Gardeners' Corner with David Maxwell. Wheelchair access is available to the main pond but not the perimeter walk around Brockkagh Wood.

City of Derry, now home to many of the gardens magnolia and camellia collections. Hard surface paths suitable for wheelchairs and prams through the arboretum and gardens. Please note that some paths may be quite steep.

Refreshments available by request. Adm £6, chd free.** Clayburn has been transformed from an exposed site in the shadow of Slemish Mountain to become a low maintenance prairie style garden. Shrubs, grasses and insect attracting perennials along with traditional hedging and many dry stone walls. Also incorporated are numerous trees providing both windbreaks and habitat for many bird species.

**12 NEW CLENDINNING COTTAGE A3/B3**

71 Cloghcor Road, Lisbellaw, BT94 5BH. Mr I & Mrs J Black. ¼m from village of Lisbellaw. Approaching Lisbellaw from the A4 Belfast Rd turn L onto Faughard Rd, B140. After 0.3 m turn L onto Cloghcor Rd and the garden is ½ m along on R. **Fri 15, Sat 16 May (2-5). Adm £5, chd free. Cream teas.** This is an established garden on an ancient site incorporating a bronze age stone circle. The elevated position affords extensive views towards Cuilcagh World Heritage Park which encompasses one of the largest expanses of blanket bog in Northern Ireland. Extensive herbaceous planting is enhanced by clipped box hedging and topiary. In addition an antique and garden business adjoins.

From lower deck Craigavon Bridge turn L to Letterkenny. Pass settlement at Nixon's Corner then ½m with entrance on R (white gates) through black iron gates and cattle grid. **Visits by arrangement 27 Apr to 30 May for groups of up to 20. Adm £7.** A mature garden set in 2½ acres of woodland surrounding a Georgian house c1780 (not open). Variety of trees and shrubs most notably a collection of rhododendrons, camellias and azaleas with mature trees, some dating from the construction of the house. Easy access with a network of level gravel or grass paths with a profusion of bluebells in late April/early May. Some remnants of United States naval hospital in the grounds from 1943 to 1945. Owner can be available for short introductory talk to groups. Wheelchair access to main features.

A mature garden planted with colourful herbaceous plants and shrubs, surrounding a charming house built in 1840. Stunning views of the Mourne enhance the drifts of snowdrops and daffodils at the start of the year followed by Eucryphia displays in August.

Monea, Enniskillen, BT74 8GE. J and G Thompson. 5½m NW of Enniskillen. From Enniskillen take A46 to Belleek, after approx 1m turn L (B81 to Derrygonnelly) After 5m, just before Monea, turn R onto Devenish Church Rd. No 9 is last bungalow on L. **Sat 25, Sun 26 July (2-5). Adm £5, chd free. Cream teas.** Refreshments in aid of FGS Charity - Pancreatic Cancer.

Just 17 yrs on from a neglected site with poor soil, this delightful small garden now contains sunny sitting areas and many flowering plants. Bulbs, perennials and climbers, intermingled with roses and shrubs are planted to provide all year colour. Annuals grown in a cutting bed are used to fill gaps when the perennials finish and a glut of salads and vegetable are produced in raised beds. Bouquets of garden flowers available to buy from near neighbour.

A bee and butterfly haven, this recently extended garden has deep herbaceous borders. Generously repeated pops of colour delight the eye and create a sense of rhythm. At the rear a wildlife pond and stone folly add interest and mature trees provide shade. Ornamental plants, tomatoes, vegetables and cut flowers are grown from seed. Stone path encircling the garden area is accessible with caution.

From Four Winds r'about, head along the Manse Rd to Lagan College on R, pass Lagan College and proceed down the hill, L'Arche Village is next on R. **Sat 20 June (12-4). Adm £5, chd free. Tea, coffee & cake.** Refreshments in aid of L'Arche.

The two acre site is a former tree nursery. Now named 'The Village', it has been developed with a community garden space, two polytunnels, a greenhouse, several working spaces and kitchens.
